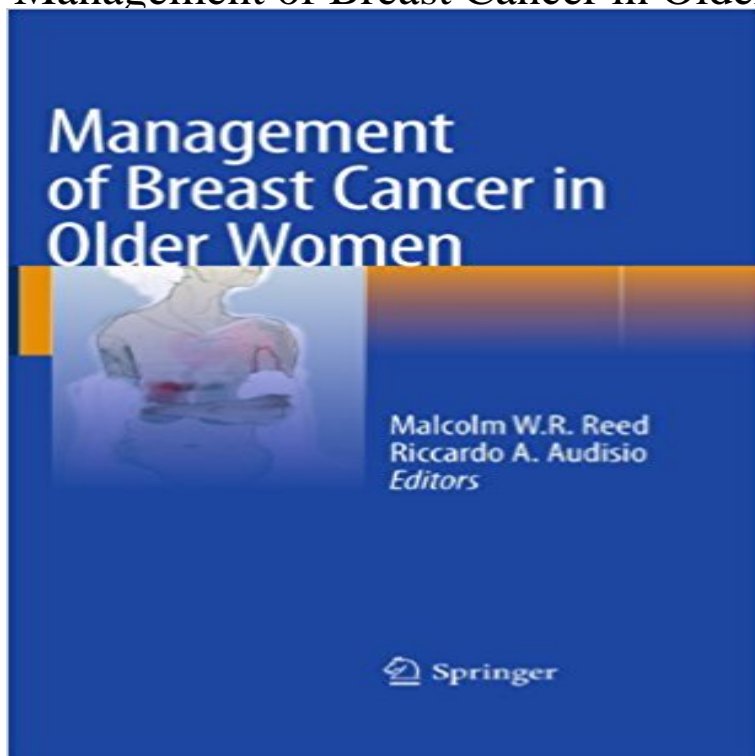


## Management of Breast Cancer in Older Women
